LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR.



Dear Reader,

Thank you for taking a moment to learn about the Ground Coordination Intelligence Service (GCIS).

Every day, children are targeted by predators, traffickers, and organized criminal networks that exploit vulnerability, technology, and opportunity. These criminals hide behind screens, manipulate victims through online platforms, and profit from the suffering of others. While many people are aware that human trafficking and child exploitation exist, few ever see the reality of what happens behind the scenes—or the immense effort required to identify offenders, protect victims, and support law enforcement efforts to bring perpetrators to justice.

GCIS was created because we refused to stand by and do nothing.

We are a U.S. Service Member-owned and operated civilian counter-trafficking and child exploitation interdiction organization dedicated to supporting law enforcement-coordinated efforts to identify, target, and help apprehend human traffickers, child predators, and dismantle the criminal networks that enable them. Our work includes cyber intelligence gathering, investigative support, network analysis, and activities focused on disrupting platforms, systems, and online environments that facilitate the exploitation of children. We also provide educational support and safety training to students and schools around the world to maintain public awareness of the dangers and signs

In the course of these efforts, we have also supported child rescue operations and contributed to investigations involving individuals who believed they could exploit children without consequence. Most recently, our team conducted an operation focused on identifying and removing age-verified gaming accounts belonging to minors on platforms associated with popular online games such as Roblox and Fortnite, reducing opportunities for predators to target and groom children through those accounts.

What makes GCIS unique is not only what we do—but how we do it.

Every operator, investigator, analyst, and asset involved with GCIS serves full-time in the United States Marine Corps (Not Endorsed). After long workdays, deployments, training exercises, and military obligations, our team dedicates its personal time to protecting children and supporting anti-trafficking efforts. We conduct investigations late at night, on weekends, during leave periods, and whenever we can find time between our professional responsibilities and family commitments.

We do not receive salaries.

We do not receive bonuses.

We do not receive reimbursements.

Every mile traveled, every hotel room booked, every piece of equipment purchased, every software license maintained, every intelligence platform utilized, and every operational expense incurred comes directly from our own pockets or from the generosity of supporters who believe this mission matters.

Many operations require travel across state lines to coordinate with partners, gather intelligence, conduct field activities, or support investigative efforts. These expenses add up quickly. Fuel, transportation, lodging, communications equipment, digital infrastructure, investigative tools, secure data storage, and operational resources are all necessary components of the work. Yet despite the cost, our team continues because the mission is bigger than any one of us.

The reality is simple: predators and traffickers do not stop because funding runs out.

Children do not stop needing protection because travel is expensive.

Victims do not get to postpone their suffering until resources become available.

That is why your support matters.

When you donate to GCIS, your contribution is not funding salaries or administrative paychecks. No member of GCIS receives compensation from donations. Every dollar is directed toward operational activities that support our mission: intelligence gathering, investigative resources, operational travel, technology, communications, cyber investigations, training, and mission-critical equipment necessary to continue protecting vulnerable children and supporting efforts against human trafficking and exploitation.

Your donation becomes fuel in a vehicle traveling to support an operation.

It becomes software that helps identify a predator.

It becomes infrastructure that allows investigators to uncover criminal networks.

It becomes a resource that helps us continue dedicating our time, skills, and expertise to protecting children who cannot protect themselves.

Most people will never meet the child whose life is changed because a predator was identified before harm occurred. They will never know the name of the victim who was helped because a criminal network was disrupted. They will never see the countless hours spent behind computer screens,

following leads, documenting evidence, coordinating efforts that may ultimately prevent exploitation before it happens, and testifying in court.

But those victories matter.

Every child protected matters.

Every predator identified matters.

Every network disrupted matters.

We believe that protecting children is not someone else's responsibility. It is everyone's responsibility. We have chosen to dedicate our time, expertise, and personal resources to this fight because we believe every child deserves safety, dignity, and the chance to grow up free from exploitation.

You become part of the effort to stand between predators and the children they seek to harm.

GCIS supports field-based initiatives that assist in gathering information, documenting potential criminal activity, strengthening community awareness, and facilitating collaboration with law enforcement agencies, nonprofit organizations, and other stakeholder groups committed to protecting vulnerable populations.

Ground operations often require extensive planning, coordination, and logistical support. Teams must be equipped with the tools, technology, training, and resources necessary to operate safely,

responsibly, and effectively while maintaining the highest standards of documentation and accountability.

Funding for Ground Operations may support:

- Travel and transportation for operational deployments, training activities, and partnership engagements
